Creation of **11** new women's CSOs supported

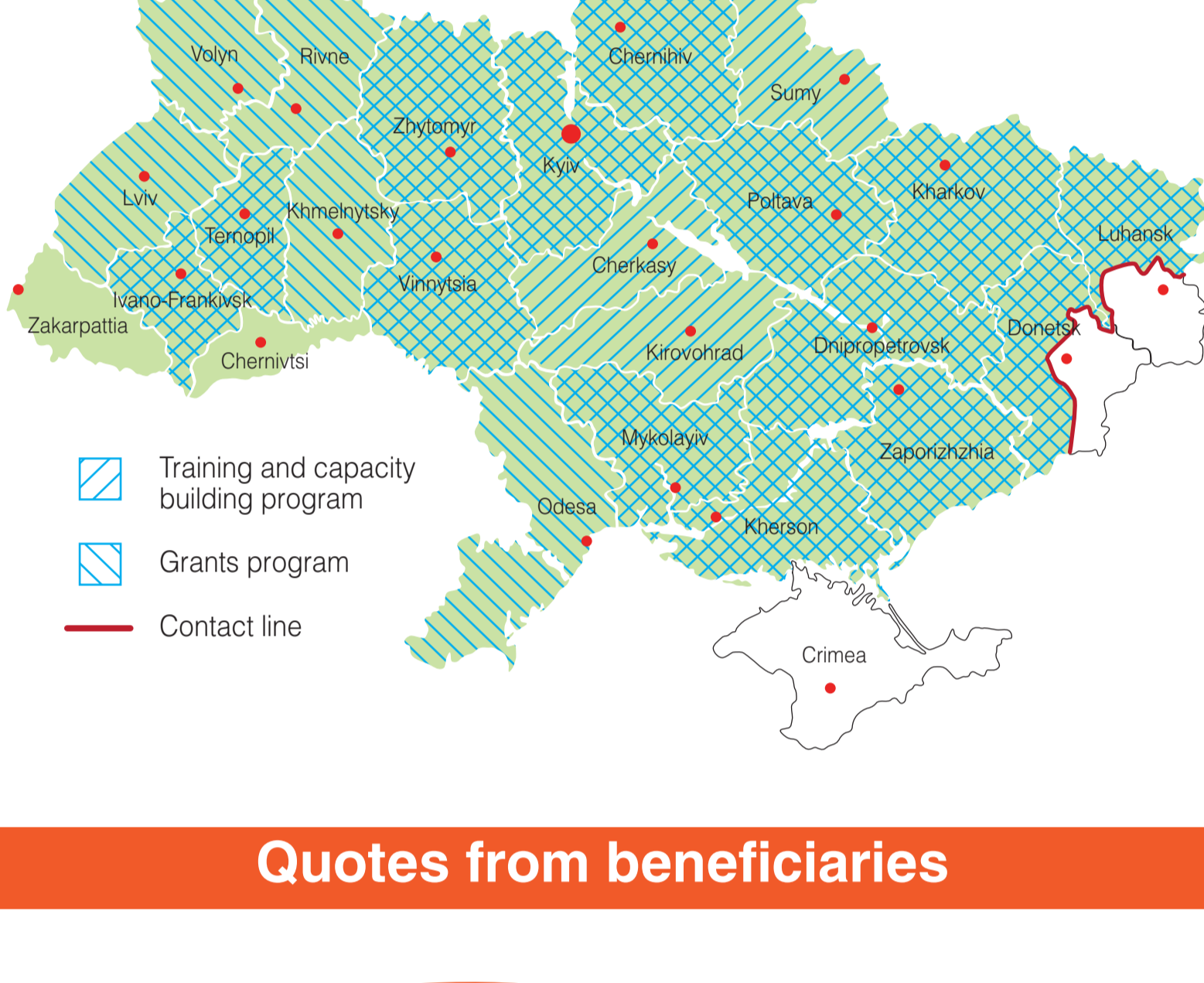
More than **5,000** people took part in the training and capacity building programs for CSOs and activists

## Quotes from beneficiaries

**Oksana Borodachova (IDP from Luhansk):**

"Due to the grant provided within "Economic Opportunities for People Affected by Conflict" project, I was able to open an additional class in my language school and create jobs for women-teachers who also moved from Luhansk. Now, I'm not the only one who has confidence in the future, but my other compatriots who were left without a home received this confidence too."

**Mira (teenager) about her participation in the FemenCamp:**

"Knowledge, emotions, development, new friends -it's a FemenCamp - Spring 2017"! It happens that during 10, 20 years of your life you are not able to learn what you will learn in a week! So, this was my case: just within one week, I grew up and became a completely different person - already a feminist."

**Katerina (pensioner) about financial literacy trainings ("Securing Future Through Financial Empowerment" Program):**

"I have lived my whole life frugally, but I didn't manage to save anything. It turns out that saving is not just buying something cheaper. Saving means a reasonable distribution of income. Now, after the training, I understand this."

**Bella Antonyan-Shevchuk ("First Step to Success" Program graduate) about the conference "Feminists in Dialogue – Bridging the Gaps":**

"We are grateful to the Ukrainian Women's Fund for the idea to initiate a dialogue about the differences between feminists of all ages, as well as for the opportunity to communicate with colleagues from Germany and Georgia. Due to this, we have seen that, despite the fact that differences in views do exist, yet it is much more that unite us. Now we see that it is more important to pay attention to what unites us and not to what makes us different. Each of us has its own views, opinion, right now we think that this should not separate us."

**Elena Senchenkova (community mobilizer in Luhansk oblast) about her personal development:**

A woman lived in a small village at the edge of Ukraine. She was an ordinary woman, just like everyone else, the ordinary woman, ordinary mother, ordinary wife, just a daughter, just a granddaughter. And she tried to play all the roles simply perfect. But the new time has come, it brought new opportunities and new goals along. With the new understanding of yourself. With understanding of your strength, your internal resources. Personal goals and belief in the fact that I am not simply a woman today – I'm a personality! Today, my life is a kaleidoscope of events, of important and right things. Thank you to the Ukrainian Women's Fund for a unique project that changes lives of ordinary women.
